Parents' Forum Minutes 27.3.24 at 9.00

- Present

The group went out to watch the EYFS and KS1 Easter Bonnet Parade

- Minutes of the last meeting shared, matters arising:
CH said that the transition into school for new YR children would be quicker, as requested by the group. Children would likely come until 1.00 on the first two days and start full time the following week.
Pen Licenses were discussed and one child had only just got his. It was suggested that rather than pens being removed, a list of those who have their pen license should be given to the next teacher, children should start with their pen and then try to maintain it.
- Parent Survey Results
The recent parents' survey results were shared.
The group felt the responses were mainly positive with the majority of parents saying that they would recommend the school.
A number of parents had said that they didn't know what their child was learning. Parents in the meeting said that this information was on the website.
CB suggested that any events happening in specific classes could be shared on Facebook.
Another area where fewer parents agreed was where their child with SEND was being supported.
CH said that some parents think that once their child has a diagnosis, they should be able to have a 1:1 adult. This is not the case as funding is very difficult to obtain.
Those in the meeting complemented the SENDCO, Mrs Pett on her hard work and the support she gives to parents.
CB suggested a handout for parents on the lines of 'My child has a diagnosis... what next?'
Homework was also a discussion point.
CP felt that the change in homework, being given a number of tasks over the half term was more difficult as it was easy to lose time/ tasks.
Other parents preferred this method as the pressure was off to complete in one weekend.
