School Improvement	To agree and recommend to the governing body a draft School Improvement Plan (SIP)
	To ensure that the School Self-Evaluation Summary is regularly updated.
	To prepare a schedule for monitoring progress of the SIP and to ensure that the full governing body receives regular progress reports.
Pupil Premium	To carry out the governing body's responsibilities in relation to the Pupil Premium and impact of its use on Pupil achievement
School Sports Fund	To carry out the governing body's responsibilities in relation to the School Sports Fund and impact of its use on Pupil achievement
Curriculum	To recommend to the governing body draft curriculum policies including sex education, religious education, collective worship, equal opportunities and drug education.
	Ensuring provision of RE in line with school's basic curriculum (Monitoring)
	To carry out the governing body's responsibilities in relation to target setting.
	To monitor pupil achievement against set targets.
	To carry out the governors' responsibilities in relation to children with special educational needs.
	To decide which subject options should be taught having regard to resources, and implement provision for flexibility in the curriculum (including activities outside the school day).
Pupils, parents and community	To carry out the governors' responsibilities for the website
	To make recommendations to the full governing body about appropriate mechanisms for fulfilling the governing body's accountability to parents (reporting, newsletters etc.)
	Adoption and review of home-school agreements
Pupils,	To make recommendations to the governing body on the adoption of the school behaviour policy, including the school anti-bullying policy
	To make recommendations to the governing body on the adoption of the school equal opportunities policy and to monitor and review the impact regularly.
	To review (amend) and monitor the governing body's other policies to ensure inclusion (in regard to gender, social disadvantage, race equality and disability discrimination).
	To review, at least annually, the overall pattern and use of exclusions within the school.

	To make recommendations on matters relating to the role of the school in the community, including public relations.
	To carry out other pupil and parent related tasks as delegated by the governing body.
	Carry out annual review of Safeguarding Children policy and procedures and report to the Local Authority.
Pecuniary interests	To ensure that any pecuniary interests are declared at each meeting by everyone present.

Reporting arrangements must be established between this committee and the governing body to ensure accountability for actions and decisions taken on its behalf. Also arrangements to communicate with other committees must be established.

The quorum for a standing committee is a minimum of three full governors - with staff governors not in the majority.
