

Linton Primary: Nursery provision for 2023-24

The staff and governors of Linton Primary School have considered its Nursery provision in light of pupil numbers and the introduction of Additional Funding to increase free childcare to 30 hours for working families. This is a summary of our offer from September 2023. - Single admission point in September 2023 for children whose date of birth falls between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020
 - Morning session 8:30-11:30 , Afternoon session 12:00-15:00 (Times to be confirmed)
- 26 morning or afternoon session places available for children with Universal Funding
- Up to 26 afternoon sessions available, where numbers allow, to already attending children with Additional Funding or privately funded Pay & Stay. All afternoon sessions to be booked a week in advance.
- Pay & Stay sessions to be paid in advance at a rate of £20.00 per session which includes a school lunch.
- Pay & Stay sessions not attended due to illness charged at 50%. Pay & Stay sessions not attended due to other reasons charged at 100%.
- Lunch options for afternoon session children are either School Hot Dinner (chargeable at DCC school dinner rate) or packed lunch from home.

- Admissions

In the event of oversubscription, the following priorities will apply:

1. Children with Linton Nursery named on Statement of Special Educational Needs or an EHC plan
2. Looked After Children, or children who were but ceased to be because they were adopted or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.
3. Children who have/will have a sibling attending the school on the day of admission. (sibling defined as: brother and/or sister; half-brother and/or half-sister; legally adopted child being regarded as a brother or sister; step-brother or step-sister residing in the same family unit.)
4. Children living in the Normal Catchment Area (map available in school)
5. Other children (living outside the Normal Catchment Area)

In the event of choices needing to be made between children satisfying the same criteria, these children living nearest to the school (measured by the nearest available route) will be given preference.

Any appeals will be considered by a Governor Committee

- In-year starters will be admitted if there are places available.
